The City's "Doggie Splash Day" will be held at Evans Swimming Pool, 1200 Hillcrest in Mesquite, on Saturday, August 19, from 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. Dogs will be charged \$5.00; accompanying humans will be charged \$1.00.

Dogs will be allowed to utilize all of the pool amenities including the wading pool, speed slide and one-meter diving board. PetSmart of Mesquite will sponsor the following contests:

- **Doggie Talent Show** Tricks, skills and unique talents will be on display during this contest.
- **Swim Suit Competition (for the dogs)** Sponsor will provide awards and judge this contest in a variety of categories.
- **Dog Paddle Race** Dogs will be set to swim across the pool for 10 yards in a timed event. Owners may do anything to encourage their contestants.
- **Retrieving Contest** Owners will toss their own objects for a minimum of 30 feet requiring dogs to fetch and return in this timed event.
- **Diving Contest** Free-style competition off a one-meter diving board.



All dogs will be required to have current vaccinations to enter the pool. Mesquite Health Division officials will assist with dog registration information and will assist with any overly aggressive participants. ## Environmental Code

It's that time of year again! Grass and weeds are growing throughout the city. Environmental Code Inspectors will be driving through neighborhoods to make sure that all properties are properly mowed. They will also check for any violations with outside storage, parking, inoperable vehicles, fencing and property maintenance.

Grass and weeds over 12 inches in height are in violation of City ordinance. Upon viewing yards that contain grass in height that exceeds this limitation, inspectors will send notification to residents to have the property mowed within 10 days. If compliance is not achieved, a contractor will be hired by the City to mow the property at the owner's expense.

The Environmental Code Division appreciates the cooperation it receives throughout the year from residents and property owners who want to keep Mesquite a beautiful place to live. To report a code violation, use one of the following options:

## Scooter Scam

Fraud in the form of power chairs and scooters for seniors is taking a big bite from the Medicare budget. Fraud occurs when Medicare is billed for services or equipment that is not needed or that the patient never receives. Many seniors have been told, "You should go ahead and buy this power chair or scooter. You might not need it now, but you may need it in the future and be unable to get one." The Medicare patient thinks, why not, it does not cost me anything and I might need it someday. You order one and Medicare gets the bill. A doctor is the only person who should determine medical needs and this includes power chairs and scooters.

Watch out for suppliers who:

- ✦ Offer a "free" wheelchair or scooter
- ✦ Want you to use their doctors
- ✦ Offer to waive coinsurance or deductibles
- ✦ Recommend a motorized wheelchair when you have requested a scooter



Be especially aware of companies to which you did not give your number. They may have purchased your number and be making "cold calls." Also, be sure to review any recommendations you receive from anyone with your doctor and family members.

Another important thing to remember is to review your Medicare Summary Notice. This will list all of the services and supplies billed in your name to Medicare. If an item or service is different from what you received, contact the provider. If you suspect fraud, call the Inspector General's Hotline at (800) 447-8477.
