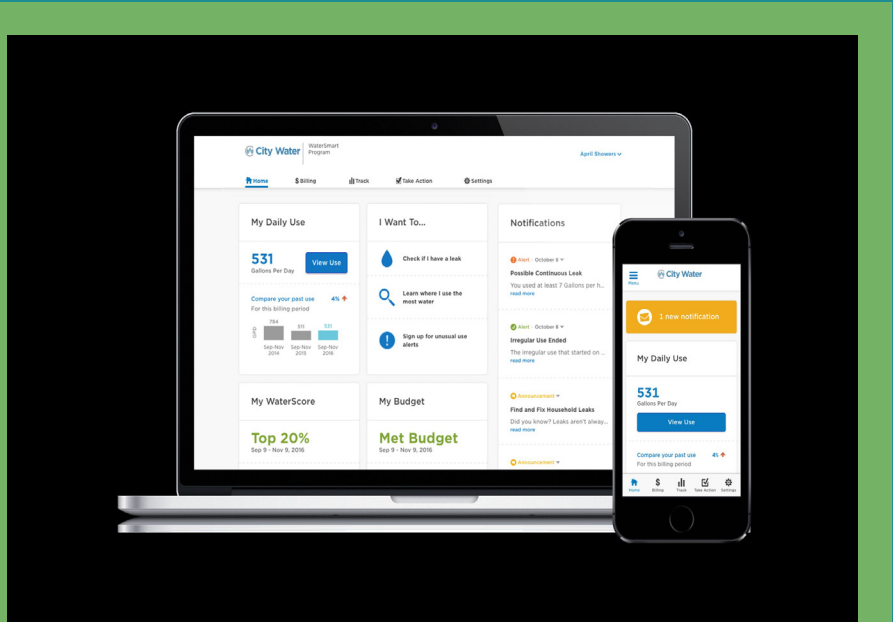

WaterSmart tracks residents water usage

The City of Mesquite has partnered with WaterSmart to offer residents detailed information about household water use.

WaterSmart is a free online service that provides tools to understand and manage water use, detect potential leaks, and get the most value from every drop of water used. Mesquite water customers can access all utility data as soon as it becomes available on an hourly, daily, or monthly basis to view water use compared to similar-sized homes by neighborhood and get access to customized recommendations for how to save water and money. A “leak alert” feature will launch in May.

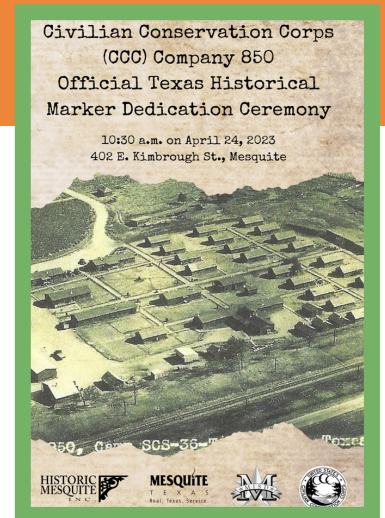

Historical marker installed honoring Depression-era conservation camp

On April 24, a historical marker was installed at Mesquite High School Baseball Fields, 402 E. Kimbrough St., by officials from the City of Mesquite, Historic Mesquite, Inc., Mesquite Independent School District and Dallas County Historical Commission.

The Official Texas Historical Marker was installed to honor Mesquite's Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) Company 850. Civilian Conservation Corps camps were formed across the Great Plains region during the Great Depression by President Franklin D. Roosevelt to put young men to work and abate soil-eroding farming practices.

Mesquite's CCC Company 850 workers helped build levees along the Trinity River and provided demonstrations for farmers on terracing, pasture contouring, strip-cropping and pasture sodding and seeding. Visit www.cityofmesquite.com/HMI for more information.

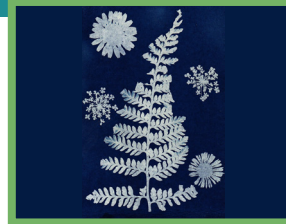
