Pothole Blitz and Road Report Update

The Walker, Tripp, and Mariposa project began in October. Work started on Mariposa Drive and was completed in December. Construction is now underway on Tripp Road, with work expected to finish in January 2026. Construction on Walker Street may begin once work on Tripp Road is complete. The overall project is expected to be finished in Spring 2025. Also, crews repaired 189 potholes across several neighborhoods and corridors during last month's Pothole Blitz.
