The general public hours are from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday, and 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. The Main Library is offering special hours, from 9 to 10 a.m., Monday through Saturday, for seniors ages 65 or older, families with children ages 13 and under and customers with underlying health issues. 
## Downtown Mesquite honored with National Accreditation



The Mesquite Downtown Development program has earned a designation as a Nationally Accredited Main Street program. The honor was announced recently by the National Main Street Center. ## Voluntary compliance is the key to Code Enforcement



Neighborhood Services presented the City of Mesquite's quarterly report at the beginning of June. In the second quarter, the number of code violations decreased from the same quarter in 2019. The number of complaints increased from the same period last year due to the new myMesquite app launch in January of 2020. However, even though the number of complaints increased, voluntary compliance continues to take the lead as the number one method of compliance as 91 percent of cases were resolved voluntarily.

Nine out of every ten Mesquite property owners are eager to fix issues. Maria Martinez, Director of Neighborhood Services said, "Encouraging voluntary compliance through education of our city codes is key and that's where we want to be."

## City offers Utility Bill Assistance



The City of Mesquite is trying to help residents who are struggling to pay their utility bills due to the coronavirus pandemic. If you need help paying your utility bill the City is offering longer-term payment plans. You can learn more about this and other options by calling the Utility Billing Office at 972-216-6208.

Each month, the City of Mesquite lets residents know if their account is delinquent and if they are at risk of a cutoff if they don't pay or contact the City. Due to the pandemic, the City has temporarily paused actual cutoffs of service at this time.

## Council Community Focus



The City of Mesquite will repair an additional six miles of residential streets by July 2021 with the next Real. Texas. Roads. project. Approved by the City Council on June 15, these repairs will add to the 27 miles of neighborhood streets already improved through the program. The contractor, Estrada Concrete Company, is expected to begin repairs in July. The City will have street inspectors out in the neighborhoods educating residents about the repairs and answering questions. The repairs will include a full depth repair with new reinforced concrete on certain street and sidewalk locations that have moderate to severe pavement failure.




City staff met with representatives of the Mesquite TX Tri East NAACP. The goal of the meeting was to open a dialogue to help enhance racial equality in the community.


