
Community congregations will Spread the Love on "National Be Someone Day"

City Council to begin redistricting process with public input

In May, Mesquite voters approved a proposed City Charter amendment that would create six single-member districts for City Council Places 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6. This week, Mesquite took steps forward on the creation of the six new single-member districts for the City Council. The City will seek public input on the process this fall. The planning schedule includes the City Council adopting a new redistricting plan in November, and these new districts will go into effect for the November 2019 municipal elections.
