This week the Texas Historical Commission (THC) designated Mesquite as one of the new incoming 2019 Texas Main Street cities. THC made the announcement today at their quarterly commission meeting in Laredo. Mesquite will officially enter the THC's Texas Main Street Program on January 1, bringing the number of fully designated Main Street communities in Texas to 89. 
Mesquite Police Department lowers crime with prevention efforts and help from residents

Mesquite residents have known for some time that their community has appreciated a 30-year low in overall crime, now they can feel safer as the Mesquite Police Department releases new facts. After comparing the results of their crime prevention efforts, the department has confirmed a 45 percent decrease in residential burglaries from July to September of 2018 compared to the same three months in 2015.
