Neighborhood Services Director Raymond Rivas noted a decrease in overall complaints for the year, as well as an increase in voluntary compliance with citations issued. The department was proud to report the average timeline to close a compliance case has dropped from 26 days at the beginning of the year to an average of 22 days this quarter.
