Council approves zoning changes for an 80-acre industrial park

On June 3, the City Council approved zoning changes to allow for a new industrial park called Urban District 30. The master-planned business park will sit on more than 80 acres along I-30 and will consist of five buildings with more than 979,000 square-feet of industrial space. Urban District 30 is a \$71 million investment by Urban Logistics Realty and is expected to generate more than 500 jobs in Mesquite. [Watch the presentation.](#)



Bond sale approved to fund improvements in Iron Horse Public Improvement District

On June 3, the City Council approved the sale of bonds to fund infrastructure improvements in the Iron Horse Public Improvement District (PID), approximately 58 acres of land located north of Rodeo Drive.
