

City Council approves speed limit reductions on certain roadways

Based on a new traffic engineering study, the City Council recently approved an ordinance reducing the speed limits on certain roads: from 45 mph to 40 mph on East Cartwright Road from Mesquite Valley Road to Lawson Road; from 45 mph to 35 mph on Rodeo Center Blvd. from Bruton Road to the south curb line of Military Parkway; from 45 mph to 35 mph on Lawson Road from Interstate

Highway 20 to north City limits; and temporarily reducing the speed limit from 40 mph to 30 mph on Town East Blvd. from Samuell Blvd. to Skyline Drive due to road construction.

Protect yourself from mosquito-borne diseases with the four D's

Prevention is the best defense against the West Nile virus and other mosquito-borne diseases. Mesquite residents are reminded to remember the four D's:

- Dusk and dawn are the times of day you should try to stay indoors. This is when mosquitoes are most active.
- Dress in long sleeves and pants when you are outside.
- DEET is an ingredient to look for in your insect repellent. Follow label instructions, and always wear repellent when outdoors.
- Drain standing water in your yard and neighborhood where mosquitoes can breed. Mosquitoes may develop in any water stagnant for more than three or four days.
