Mesquite City Council approves \$5.5 million Downtown Mesquite project

The Mesquite City Council approved a construction contract for the Downtown Mesquite infrastructure project, known as Front Street Station, during the July 15 Regular

Meeting. The \$5.5 million project will improve infrastructure such as drainage and lighting, add more than 80 new parking spaces, and will create an event space, performance pavilion as well as a pocket park that will serve as a pass-through from Front Street to Main Street. Monthly Sales Tax Report

The July sales tax receipts, which represent sales activity for the month of May, for the City of Mesquite, were 0.3 percent below the amount reported for the same period last year. Year-to-date sales tax collections for the City are trending almost 2 percent above last year's collections. Sales tax contributes 27 percent of the total revenue used to support the General Fund. The City uses the General Fund for services including police, fire, parks and recreation, libraries, neighborhood services and public works. Next small business workshop to be held on July 23


