

At the May 4 City Council meeting City Manager Cliff Keheley shared plans for the City of Mesquite to make service and program adjustments due to the impacts of COVID-19. This will include keeping both libraries closed until June 1 and delaying decisions on summer camps and the City's three pools until guidance is provided by the State. The City is also canceling the June 13


Palos Verdes Lake drained for construction
