Mesquite City Council will meet on Sept. 21, at City Hall, 757 N. Galloway Avenue. The Pre-Meeting begins at 5 p.m. in Training Rooms A and B, followed by the Regular Meeting at 7 p.m. in the Council Chambers. Members of the public, applicants and interested parties may attend the meeting in person. All persons present at the meeting location must observe social distancing by remaining a minimum of six (6) feet from other meeting participants and must wear a covering over their nose and mouth.

2020 - 2024 Scheduled Residential Street Repair Schedule



City staff has compiled a list of streets to be completed in years 2020 – 2024. [Click here to read the list prepared in September 2020.](#) The list is sorted by street name and includes the general type of pavement rehabilitation method that will be used on that street segment and the estimated time to complete the construction repairs. The City Council provided approval and direction on the

priorities for the Real. Texas. Roads. program. City staff prepared estimates for each group of streets, including any needed utility and drainage construction. Streets were then grouped by neighborhood and rehabilitation or reconstruction method and were scheduled using the funding available in that year to maximize resources and for efficient

construction. The goal is to repair the most amount of residential streets as quickly as possible. If your street is not on the list, please consider that the list is evolving and other streets could be added in regards to shifts in funding and priorities.
