Westover Greenbelt Park features refurbished shelter

The picnic shelter at Westover Greenbelt Park has been refurbished, at no cost to Mesquite tax payers. The City of Mesquite's Parks and Recreation Department was able to use funds from the City's 4B Budget which is funded from sales tax, not property tax. The cost of the project was \$17,000 to refurbish the existing roof of the

shelter by using the steel structure already in place and putting a new roof on top. The efforts of staff saved the City more than \$80,000. [Learn more.](#)
