Mesquite earns top Insurance Services Office rating for fire protection

Mesquite has again earned the highest rating possible for fire protection of a community as determined by the Insurance Services Office (ISO). The Texas Department of Insurance, through the State Fire Marshal's Office, notified the Mesquite Fire Department the city had a split ISO rating of Class 01/1X. The range is 1 (superior) to 10.
