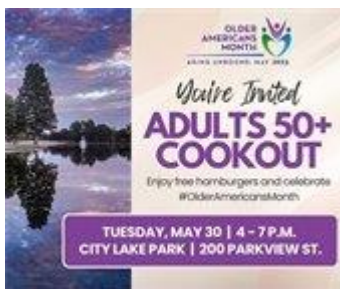
Memorial Day Service and closures

On May 29, the City of Mesquite will host a Memorial Day Service at the Mesquite Veterans Memorial, 425 S. Galloway Ave. The brief program will honor the men and women who died while serving in the United States armed forces and will begin at 2:55 p.m. to coincide with National Moment of Remembrance.

Attendees are encouraged to arrive no later than 2:50

p.m. to allow time to park and enter the memorial area, and to bring folding chairs, if needed.

Also, all City offices and facilities with exception of the Mesquite Metro Airport will be closed on May 29 in recognition of Memorial Day. No trash or recycling collected. City reports sales tax collections for May

The City of Mesquite May sales tax receipts, which represent sales activity for the month of March, was 1.5% above the amount reported for the same period last year. The current increase in sales activity is driven primarily by retail sales and utilities. Sales tax contributes 27% of the total revenue used to support the General Fund. The City uses the General Fund for services including police, fire, parks and recreation, libraries, neighborhood services and public works.



Leak alerts now available on WaterSmart service

The “leak alerts” feature of WaterSmart is now available to all City of Mesquite residents. WaterSmart, a free online service, offers residents detailed information about how to understand and manage household water use, detect potential leaks, and get the most value from every drop of water used. WaterSmart’s real-time leak notification system detects and alerts customers about potential leaks in their home and helps them identify the source of the leak.
