“Driveway service” trash collection focus to start in the spring

The Mesquite City Council has approved a change for trash collection that will focus on “driveway service.” Starting on March 4, trash will be collected at the end of residents’ driveways. The change will affect about 7,700 homes. Residents affected by the change will be notified. Collection days will not change, and the City will continue to assist elderly and disabled residents who let Solid Waste know they need help putting out their trash. City officials made the change for selected areas due to the difficulty and danger of trash collection trucks negotiating older, narrow alleys. Switching to front pickup in certain neighborhoods will make the alleys safer and cleaner, cause fewer ruts in the alleys and help trash vehicles avoid damage to fences and utilities. The changes to collection location does not change the City’s requirements for solid waste, which includes trash being secured in trash bags within an approved container, specific times on when the trash can be set out for collection, and limits on bulky items.
