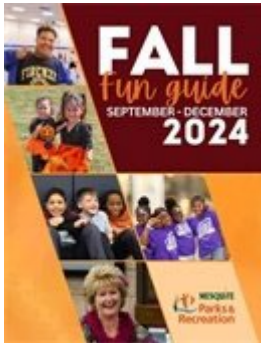


Upcoming performances from the Mesquite Symphony Orchestra
