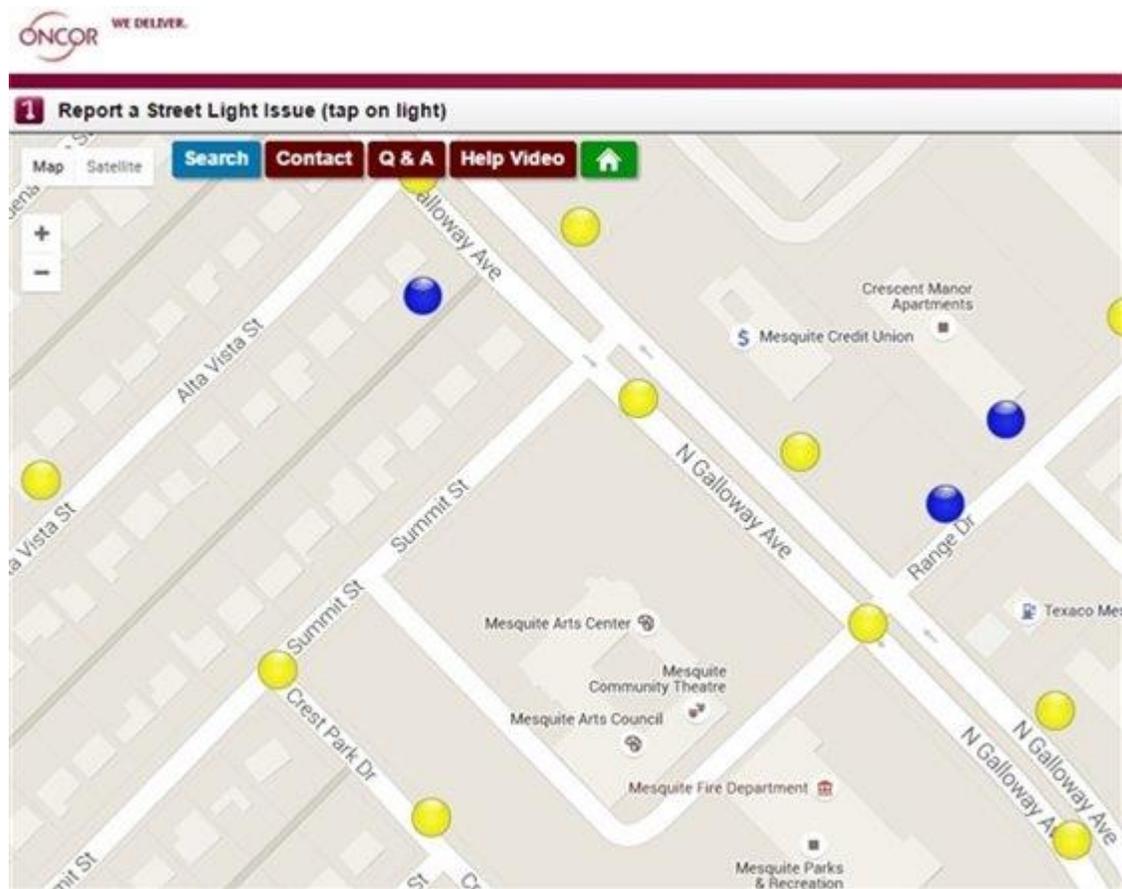
Mesquite Hosts Hospitality Meeting
